





WHAT IS RON?

- 01 Electronically signing a document
- Electronically notarizing a 02 document



Remotely witnessing the signing over video

Sounds simple, but it's a little more involved

NOTARIZATION

HOW DOES IT WORK?

State laws call for the use of specialized software:

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Buyer/Seller must answer a series of security questions

A verifiable government ID must be uploaded

Once a buyer/seller is verified, the document is signed, a tamper seal is added, and the RON transaction is recorded (audio and video) in an electronic journal.

MODEL ACT

Proposed model legislation for Remote Online Notarization should be consistent with industry standards developed by MBA, ALTA, and MISMO to provide consumer and market clarity.

Chicago Title allows remote notarization IF:

- The buyer and seller are located in the United States;
- Both the notary and the property are in a state with RON laws and published regulations; and
- One of three approved RON Software Systems must be used: NotaryCam, Notarize, or Pavaso.

THE CHALLENGES

Technical considerations for a successful RON transaction:

- High speed internet
- Newer computer/laptop
- Working webcam
- Cell phone may not be practical for reading legal documents

Virginia passes the first version of RON and allows the use of video technology to witness notarial acts.



22 states pass RON legislation, with an additional 20 states introducing bills.*



16 more states may pass RON laws.



RON will be available in states that represent 60+% of yearly residential transactions
